

Driver License Reclamation Pro Bono Project



The University of Texas School of Law is offering free legal services to people who have lost their ability to drive legally due to unpaid debts to Texas courts, the Texas Department of Public Safety, or the Municipal Service Bureau. This program can help you seek debt forgiveness for unpaid fees and take steps to regain your ability to drive legally, including assistance in obtaining an Occupational Driver License if necessary. If you are interested in this opportunity, please take the following steps:

We will use your information to determine if you are eligible for services, and will email you with an invitation to one of our two spring clinics.
2. Attend a free legal clinic. Applicants will be seen on a first-come, first-served basis, with priority given to individuals who have completed the online survey. During the clinic, students from the University of Texas School of Law will help you to (1) understand the steps needed to regain your ability to drive legally, (2) to complete paperwork proving your inability to pay, and (3) begin the process for obtaining an Occupational Driver's license if necessary. Please bring documentation of your financial status (proof of any government benefits received, recent pay stub(s), bank account balance(s), bills, outstanding debt(s), etc.) to this clinic.
